

The victim was severely beaten and then chained to the back of the truck. The victim was dragged down the road resulting in his decapitation. All three subjects are in local custody. One subject agreed to interview at which time it was determined that this act was apparently racially motivated. At least two of the subjects are parolees from the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ), and are believed to be associated with Aryan Nations or a similar white supremacist hate group. 



At this time, all three subjects are in the Jasper County Jail on a variety of local charges. Charges for the murder are pending. Investigation to this point indicates that all three subjects are affiliated with white supremist groups.

On 06/12/98, Houston received an unconfirmed report from the Deridder, Louisiana Sheriff's Office, that two bus loads of Ku Klux Klan members were en route to Jasper, Texas, in order to cause trouble at the funeral of captioned victim.

Also on 06/12/98, FBI Dallas Division learned that a number of the Black Panthers in Dallas plan to depart Dallas at approximately 7:00p.m. today, (06/12/98), en route to Jasper, Texas. Dallas' source indicated that the Panthers would be heavily armed.

In addition to the Black Panters, Khalid Muhammad, currently the leader of the Nation of Islam, is to accompany the Black Panters. Muhammad is a very racist individual and is quite outspoken. Dallas' experience with the Black Panthers and the Nation of Islam is that they are vocal and will not hesitate to get invovled in a confrontation.

Finally, Houston Division has learned that Quanell Evans, a.k.a. Quanell X, a leader of the Black Muslims, left Houston, Texas, this morning headed for Jasper, Texas. Travelling with Quanell X are approximately 8 to 10 people. They also are reportedly armed.

Due to the potentially violatile nature of the situation, Houston requests immediate canvassing of all apropriate sources and notification of results as soon as possible.



JASPER, Texas, June 13 AP - Hundreds of mourners crowded into a tiny brick church and a sweltering tent today to hear politicians and civil rights activists urge the nation not to allow the brutal death of James Byrd Jr to harm race relations.

"Turn a crucifixion into a resurrection," the Reverend Jesse Jackson exhorted mourners at the funeral for Byrd, a black man who police believe was dragged to his death a week ago by three white supremacists.

The civil rights activist suggested that a memorial be erected in Jasper that would be "a place for blacks and whites to rally, a tomb that says choose redemption over retaliation".

Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison expressed hope that Byrd's death and his family's stoic reaction would inspire others not to hate based on race.

"We are diminished by this act, but from the depths of our pain, the fog of all our disbelief, we are going to emerge stronger," she told those assembled. "We are better today because we have seen a family tested like no other family has been tested."

Others who came to honour Byrd and his family were Transportation Secretary Rodney Slater, Houston Mayor Lee Brown and civil rights activist Al Sharpton of New York.

Mourners, mostly black and dressed in their Sunday best, heard the speeches by loudspeaker outdoors in broiling heat and humidity. Ambulances stood by in case people suffered heat exhaustion.

About 200 people were in Greater New Bethel Baptist Church, and about 300 more were outside in an overflow tent.

The funeral was held a few blocks from where Byrd is thought to have climbed into a pickup truck that stopped to give him a lift last Sunday.

Byrd, 49, was savagely beaten, then shackled by his ankles to the back of the truck and dragged to death along four kilometres of a narrow, twisting rural road. Pieces of his body were scattered along the bloody trail.

Three white men - Lawrence Russell Brewer, 31, Shawn Allen Berry and John William King, both 23 - are charged with Byrd's murder. Police say Byrd was

targeted simply because he was black.

"I've defended all sorts of folks in criminal cases," said attorney William Morian, appointed yesterday to represent Brewer. "It's a horrible allegation, but at this point I've got to do what every attorney is obligated to do, zealously defend his client."

The three suspects remain jailed without bond while a multi-agency task force led by the FBI investigates. Authorities may seek the death penalty.

In an affidavit, Berry told authorities he tried to stop King and Brewer from beating Byrd in a wooded area 16 kilometres east of town. Berry's attorney, Steve Hollis, said his client is a victim of circumstance.

"You probably hear this so often - that a guy is at the wrong place at the wrong time and gets with a bunch of bad people - that you don't believe it anymore," Hollis said. "But I'm telling you that's what happened."


Others who came to honor Byrd and his family were Transportation Secretary Rodney Slater, Houston Mayor Lee Brown and civil rights activist Al Sharpton of New York.

Mourners, mostly black and dressed in their Sunday best, heard the speeches by loudspeaker outdoors in broiling heat and humidity. Ambulances stood by in case people suffered heat exhaustion.

About 200 people were in Greater New Bethel Baptist Church, and about 300 more were outside in an overflow tent.

The funeral was held a few blocks from where Byrd is thought to have climbed into a pickup truck that stopped to give him a lift last Sunday.

Byrd, 49, was savagely beaten, then shackled by his ankles to the back of the truck and dragged to death along 21/2 miles of a narrow, twisting rural road. Pieces of his body were scattered along the bloody trail.



Three white men Lawrence Russell Brewer, 31, Shawn Allen Berry and John William King, both 23, are charged with Byrd's murder. Police say Byrd was targeted simply because he was black.

''I've defended all sorts of folks in criminal cases,'' said attorney William Morian, appointed Friday to represent Brewer. ''It's a horrible allegation, but at this point I've got to do what every attorney is obligated to do, zealously defend his client.''

The three suspects remain jailed without bond while a multi-agency task force led by the FBI investigates. Authorities may seek the death penalty.

In an affidavit, Berry told authorities he tried to stop King and Brewer from beating Byrd in a wooded area 10 miles east of town. Berry's attorney, Steve Hollis, said his client is a victim of circumstance.

''You probably hear this so often that a guy is at the wrong place at the wrong time and gets with a bunch of bad people that you don't believe it anymore, '' Hollis said. ''But I'm telling you that's what happened.''

The dismembered and decapitated body of James Byrd Jr., 49, was discovered Sunday morning in a wooded area of Jasper County about 100 miles northeast of Houston. He was dragged along a two-mile stretch of the isolated road, according to Jasper County Sheriff Billy Rowles.

Byrd, who suffered from what his sister described as a seizure disorder and did not drive, was last seen late Saturday walking home from a friend's anniversary party, his relatives said.

Charged with murder were Shawn Allen Berry, 23, of Jasper; Lawrence Russell Brewer, 31, of Sulphur Springs, 50 miles east of Dallas; and John William King, 23, of Jasper.

The sheriff said Brewer and King, who had been cellmates in a Texas prison, have tattoos linking them to white supremacist groups, but he did not describe the markings.

The two had picked up Berry, an apparent friend who has also served time in prison, at his job at a Jasper movie theater.

"It has been indicated to us that these guys, while they were in prison, were part of the Aryan Nation or the Ku Klux Klan," Rowles said at a televised news conference.

Don K. Clark, special agent in charge of the Houston Field Office of the FBI, said the bureau is assisting in the investigation because of "the extreme circumstances" of the case. If it is determined that the slaying was a hate crime, federal charges could be filed.

Berry told police in a probable-cause affidavit that the three suspects were riding around Saturday night in Berry's pickup when they saw a man walking alongside the road and stopped to offer him a

He has no racist ties, attorney says

JASPER, Texas - The suspected ringleader in the slaying of a disabled black man denies any involvement in the crime or any membership in supremacist groups - in or out of prison, his lawyer said Friday.

"Obviously, he's remorseful that a man died under such circumstances, but he told me he had no involvement in that," said Randy Walker, a Jasper lawyer named Friday to represent John King, 23, of Jasper.

Mr. King and two other suspects each met their court-appointed attorneys at the Jasper County Jail, where they are being held without bond in the the brutal slaying of James Byrd Jr.

The attorney for Shawn Berry, 23, said that his client, who has cooperated with police, is sorrowful and still "visibly shaken" but that he denies taking part in the killing.

"If he could somehow make everything right again he certainly would do it," said Steve Hollis, who described Mr. Berry as nonracist. "He's sorry, deeply sorry that this happened."

The attorney for Lawrence Brewer, 31, of Sulphur Springs - the third defendant and Mr. King's former prison cellmate - declined to discuss the case or reports that his client was an avowed white supremacist.

The legal developments unfolded as Mr. Byrd's family prepared for his funeral on Saturday in Jasper, an event expected to draw widespread attention.

Mr. Byrd, 49, a father of three, was beaten then chained to a pickup and dragged to death on a bumpy asphalt road. Mr. Berry has told authorities that the three white men were riding in his pickup when he saw Mr. Byrd and offered him a ride. Mr. Berry said Mr. King became furious and later drove to a deserted area where he began beating Mr. Byrd.

At his wake Friday, Mr. Byrd's casket was surrounded by flowers and notes from well-wishers. A photograph showed Mr. Byrd, his arms outstretched and a grin on his face. Many people cried silently. Some sat dazed in the lobby.

"We've lived in this community for 22 years," said James Coleman. "We've come so far in 22 years as a community, that this was just such a blow to us. Such a blow. We had to come."

Investigators believe Mr. Byrd, who lived on medical disability checks for a variety of physical ailments, including arthritis, was killed simply because he was black, and the crime has become a national symbol of racial intolerance.

Attorney General Janet Reno, in a speech Friday to the national convention of the Arab-American Anti-Discrimination Committee, said: "We have seen in Jasper, Texas, an example that hate and bigotry in its worst and most tragic form is still with us.

"None of us can relax while that happens in America," she said.

As authorities continue to gather evidence to seek the death penalty, information about the suspects continued to emerge, including that Mr. Brewer recently divorced his Hispanic wife, the mother of his son.

Those who know Mr. King and Mr. Brewer said it was prison, not small-town East Texas, that left the men brimming with hate-based ideology and belligerence.

"If he was a white-supremacist type, he sure didn't get that at home," said a woman who has known Mr. King his entire life. She described the King family as "good, salt-of-the-earth people who would never condone that sort of stuff."

The father, Ronald King, issued a statement this week extending his sympathy to Mr. Byrd's family.

Prison records show that Mr. King made it to the 10th grade at Jasper High School. That year, the records show, he was suspended for "dipping" - using chewing tobacco or snuff.

He got a high school equivalency degree from Angelina College in Lufkin in 1993.

Mr. Berry, who came from a broken home, quit school after the 8th grade.

Mr. King and Mr. Berry were convicted in October 1992 of a burglary in Jasper. They were sent to a boot camp, a detention facility normally reserved for younger and less dangerous offenders. Both were released on probation the next year.

The cure appeared to take for Mr. Berry, at least mostly. His only further offenses, according to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice, were a minor probation violation in 1993 and a drunken driving charge in October 1996.

Mr. King, however, continued to violate the terms of his probation. In July 1995, he was sent to the Beto 1 Prison in Tennessee Colony, Texas.

There he met Mr. Brewer, a seasoned con with an arrest record for burglaries and drug offenses dating to 1986.

Before Mr. King went off to prison, "he was just a normal guy," said a relative who has known him since childhood.

"He was kind of a loner, even as a kid. But he was very well-mannered, real quiet," said the relative, who declined to be named.

A very different Mr. King came home from the Beto prison last July, after two years behind bars.

"He was much bigger, all muscular," said the relative. "I don't know if it was from pumping iron or what. And he had all these tattoos."

At least one of those prison tattoos indicated membership in the Confederate Knights of America, a white supremacist group closely affiliated with the Ku Klux Klan, a prison official who specializes in gang activities said this week.

Also, prison records show, Mr. King changed his religious affiliation from Baptist to "Odinism," a sect embraced by Nazi groups. Mr. Brewer listed no denomination at first but later changed that to "Christian Identity," a religious movement closely aligned with racist organizations.

The attorney for Mr. Brewer, William S. "Billy" Morian, said his client appeared stunned Friday when he heard that the case has attracted international attention and outrage.

"His mood was very somber, and he was very quiet. I can tell you that he appears to me to be - well, he's scared as hell," Mr. Morian said.

Mr. Brewer left Cooper High School in Cooper, Texas, in the 11th grade, according to his prison records. He later got a high school equivalency degree from East State University in Commerce, Texas.

In 1993, he married a Hispanic woman from Fort Worth, the mother of his son. He divorced from his wife less than a week before the Byrd killing.

"If he didn't like other races, he never showed anything like that," said Marina Nunes, the mother of Mr. Brewer's wife, Sylvia Nunes, 33, of Fort Worth. Her daughter declined to comment.

Mr. Brewer was returned to prison for a probation violation in February 1994. After his release from prison last September, he visited his wife once in Fort Worth, her mother said, then filed for divorce.

Mr. Berry was working as manager at a Jasper theater at the time of the killing. He was engaged to be married in August to a girlfriend who was the mother of his infant daughter.

Mr. Hollis, the attorney for Mr. Berry, said his client has recounted getting into arguments over Mr. King's white supremacist beliefs. "He tried to get them not to bring it up," Mr. Hollis said.

"All this talk about white supremacist groups, he's not a part of any of those. He's got lots of friends, black and white. He doesn't agree with that stuff, and he doesn't hate anybody, "Mr. Hollis said of Mr. Berry.

Shawn Berry, 23, is tormented by the dragging death of black hitchhiker James Byrd Jr., whose funeral today will be attended by thousands, the lawyer said.

"He stutters. He gets to the point of crying when he thinks back and recalls what happened," lawyer Steve Hollis said.

"You probably hear this so often - that a guy is at the wrong place at the wrong time and gets with a bunch of bad people - that you don't believe it anymore," he said.

"But I'm telling you that's what happened."

Berry has been cooperating with police and told authorities his co-defendants, John William King and Lawrence Brewer, tortured Byrd because of the color of his skin.

He claims he tried to stop the beating and dragging.

King, 23, and Brewer, 31, both sport tattoos linking them to white supremacist groups, and they were monitored for racist views while they shared a prison cell in 1995.

Prosecutors have said they want to build a death-penalty case against the suspects, and federal prosecutors may take over and file civil-rights and hate-crime charges.

Authorities have said they may need to cut a deal with one suspect - presumably Berry - in exchange for testimony about the racial motive for the murder.

Brewer's court-appointed lawyer, William Morian, promised a vigorous defense for his client.

"I've defended all sorts of folks in criminal cases," he said.

"It's a horrible allegation, but at this point, I've got to do what every attorney is obligated to do: zealously defend his client."

King's attorney, Randy Walker, had no comment on the case - which shocked the nation and left the tiny town of Jasper reeling.

Large crowds were expected for Byrd's wake last night as Jasper tried to heal its wounds and present a united front against prejudice.

The Rev. Jesse Jackson, the Rev. Al Sharpton and other black leaders will attend today's funeral at Greater New Bethel Baptist Church.

Moses Stewart, the father of Yusuf Hawkins, a black teen slain by whites in Bensonhurst in 1989, also will be there.

The White House is sending Transportation Secretary Rodney Slater to represent the Clinton administration.

Despite the attention, Byrd's family is planning a quiet, short service.

"We think, basically, enough is enough," his sister, Clara Taylor, said. "What we really want is for everybody to leave us alone Saturday."

JASPER, Texas, June 11 AP - As this small Texas community tried to heal itself, the father of one of three white men accused in the gruesome death of a black hitchhiker apologised for his son.

"It hurts me deeply to know that a boy I raised and considered to be the most loved boy I knew could find it in himself to take a life, " Ronald King wrote in a letter released today.

"Again, I want to say I'm sorry."

Prosecutors are considering a death penalty case against his 23-year-old son, John William King, and two other men suspected of dragging James Byrd by a chain from the back of a pickup truck.

Mary Verrett, Byrd's sister, said today that she appreciated the elder King's apology.

"As a parent myself I can understand his anguish. As a parent you question yourself, 'Did I do something wrong? Did I overprotect? Did I not discipline enough?'" she told NBC's Today.

Two of the suspects were monitored by Texas prison authorities because of their involvement in racial hate groups, the Houston Chronicle reported today in a copyright story.

King and Lawrence Russell Brewer, 31, had been monitored for possible affiliation with the Ku Klux Klan and the Confederate Knights of America, a skinhead group, while they were housed at the Beto I Unit in Tennessee Colony, said Sammy Buentello, assistant director of the Texas prison system's gang task force.

Buentello said one of the men had been disciplined for involvement in a 1995 racial disturbance between whites and Hispanics at Beto.

Prison records show only King was in that prison at that time.

King and Brewer both have tattoos indicating white supremacist beliefs.

The Rev Jesse Jackson today led ministers of both colours in a vigil at Byrd's church. He said the 49-year-old man's gruesome death early Sunday could help bring blacks and whites together.

"There's a sense of agony everywhere," Jackson said.

"And that's a step in the right direction. When I looked at those ministers, white and black, I thought what a great opportunity to close the race gap."

Chicago Bulls basketball player Dennis Rodman has offered to pay Byrd's funeral expenses, Jackson announced.

"They always portray Dennis as some kind of buffoon," Jackson said.

"I think it was a tremendous gesture."

Rodman played two seasons for the San Antonio Spurs and attended junior college for a year in Cooke County in northern Texas.

"The fact he used to live in Texas was one reason he is concerned," said Rodman agent, Dwight Manley.

"But even more than this being just a Texas issue, or a racial issue, it's a human issue with him."

The other suspect besides King and Brewer is Shawn Allen Berry, 23. The three, all with criminal records, are jailed without bond on the murder charge.

District Attorney Guy James Gray said prosecutors are considering whether the evidence is strong enough to add a second felony charge, such as kidnapping, which would make it a capital punishment case.

"The very nature of this crime puts it into the death penalty," Gray said.

Gray said it is possible one of the men could be spared the capital murder charge if his testimony is needed against the others.

Federal agencies have joined the investigation.

"We are determined the investigation will be thorough, will be fair and the guilty will be brought to justice," President Clinton said.

Byrd's mangled torso was found Sunday on a bumpy, winding country road about 10 miles from his Jasper home. His severed head, neck and right arm were about a mile away. Investigators found a trail of blood along a two mile stretch of road.

Byrd was last seen walking home from a niece's bridal shower Saturday night. He apparently accepted a ride from the suspects, one of whom he knew.

At the church service in this town of 8,000 some 150 miles north-east of Houston, the congregation sang and cried.

"We live together, we pray together, we share each other's food, money, cars," said the Rev John Hardin of Mount Olive Baptist Church.

"You cannot let this divide us. The right word now is 'Togetherness'."





The subjects then drove with the victim to a remote logging road, where the victim was beaten unconscious, then tied to the back of the truck with a tow chain and dragged for some distance.

Crime scene investigation and autopsy reports revealed the victim was alive when he was chained to the rear bumper of the pick-up truck and dragged 1000 yards down a logging road which terminated onto Huff Creek Road, a paved county road. He was then dragged another 2.3 miles along the paved road. The body struck a concrete culvert along the route, resulting in the torso being pulled apart. The head and right shoulder region of the body were discovered approximately .2 miles from the rest of the torso.

Several items of physical evidence have been recovered, linking captioned subjects to the crime scene. A witness has also been located who places the victim alive, in the back of truck during the early morning hours prior to his death.

Captioned subjects are all former inmates in the Texas state prison system. Interviews of prison officials and reviews of inmate records indicate that Brewer and King displayed signs and maintained associations indicative of a belief in the white supremacist ideology. As such, officials of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice-Institutional Division (TDCJ-ID) prison system monitored their activity while the three were incarcerated. Based on records confiscated by TDCJ-ID from the cells of Brewer and King and obtained by the FBI, it appears that Brewer and King displayed an interest in joining or leading a prison-based cell of the Confederate Knights of America (CKA).

CKA is apparently led by Contrary to media accounts, TDCJ-ID gang intelligence personnel did not identify the captioned subjects as members of the Texas Aryan Brotherhood (TAB), a large white supremacist gang in TDCJ-ID and elsewhere. The extent of the subjects' associations with TAB and/or other white supremacist prison gangs are as yet unknown.

Two of the three subjects are extensively tattooed. Each have both arms covered in body art in what they call "sleeves" and much of their torso is also covered. Some of these tattoos are believed to have significance in the white supremacist movement.

A large volume of white supremacist literature and letters was recovered during searches of the subjects' Jasper, Texas residence. Items include books and letters that indicate subjects' affinity for racist literature. Inmate correspondence copied by TDCJ-ID personnel indicates that both King and Berwer were organizers of the small CKA chapter. Interviews with acquaintances of King and Brewer indicate that they may have planned to expand the CKA organization into Jasper. Forms with the names of approximately fifteen CKA members were copied by prison officials. Further details will be provided to Charlotte as Houston thoroughly evaluates the seized evidence.

In a statement provided by Lawrence Russell Brewer was quoted as saying "We're starting the Turner Diaries early" as the victim was dragged down the road.

Investigation is continuing in Houston. Field offices and FBIHQ will be apprised of significant developments.



requested that a toxicology examination, consisting of a blood alcohol content and drug screen, be conducted on the blood of BYRD. However, the JCDA also stressed that the DNA testing of BYRD's blood is more important to the case than the toxicology testing. If the FBI Lab is unable perform both the requested DNA and toxicology examinations due to the limited amount of blood sample available, priority should be given to the DNA testing.
